

Margaret Elizabeth Pritchard was born in Winston-Salem, N.C., on October 27, 1936. She attended elementary schools in that city and graduated from James A. Gray High School in June, 1955. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from Wake Forest College (now University) in 1959 and a Master of Science degree from Vanderbilt University in 1962. In 1993 she completed a Doctor of Education degree at Memphis State University (now the University of Memphis). She moved to Memphis and married Howard P. Pritchard in 1962. They have two sons, Dr. Howard P. Pritchard, Jr., and Dr. Wilson C. Pritchard.

A resident of Central Gardens for 35 years, she has served as president of the Central Gardens Association, the Christian Brothers High School Mothers Club, the Memphis Symphony League, the Woman's Exchange, and Our Home and Garden Club. She was a member and chairman of the Memphis Landmarks Commission and served on the Community Relations Commission.
