Jackson (Jack) W. Moore is the retired Executive Chairman, President and CEO of Regions Financial Corporation (RF on the NYSE), headquartered in Birmingham, AL, one of the nation's largest regional financial companies, which conducts its business activities through banks and affiliated companies. RF is the parent company of Regions Bank and Morgan Keegan, Inc. Mr. Moore had served as Chairman, President and CEO of Union Planters Corporation, based in Memphis, TN, prior to its merger with RF in 2004. He is actively involved with a privately owned bank in his hometown of Clanton, Alabama.

Moore has a lifelong commitment to religious, civic and educational organizations and has served in many capacities over the years. He currently serves as the Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Vanderbilt University and is a member of the board of Youth Programs, Inc. which produces the PGA Tour event in Memphis, the Fed-Ex Classic, and is a past chairman of the National Board of Vanderbilt Law School, where he was an Order of the Coif graduate. He also chairs the President's Cabinet at the University of Alabama, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in 1970. He is a Director of Methodist LeBonheur Healthcare, one of the country's largest private healthcare providers, based in Memphis, Tennessee.

He is a recipient of the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award bestowed by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America and the Distinguished Citizen Award in 2004 for his lifelong contributions to the Mid-South community.
